Purpose

Thrown to the Wolves is an innovation competition for area high schools that is inspired by the “Shark Tank” television program. Students will demonstrate critical thinking, creativity, collaboration, and communication skills by:

1. Developing an innovative project as an entrepreneur
2. Preparing a pitch and business/marketing campaign for that innovation.

Eligibility

High school sophomores, juniors, or seniors from Arkansas are eligible. The sponsor for the student/ student group must be a current school employee. Home school students are also eligible to compete.

How the Competition Will Work

The competition takes place in 2 rounds at A-State's Centennial Hall on February 24, 2027.

Starting Round

Teams will present a ninety second elevator pitch to starting round judges. Judges will then ask questions about the product/business idea. The judges will use rubrics to score each team based on their elevator pitch and the business/marketing plan they submitted. The top scoring teams will advance to the final round.

Final Round

Judges will ask in depth questions about the product and business/marketing plan.

Students will present a three minute pitch, prototype, and marketing plan to the judges ("Alphas"). Awards will be presented for 1st, 2nd, 3rd place, and Pack Pick, an award chosen through voting on the day of the competition.

How the University Will Assist All Participants

We will provide all schools with the tools to help create your business plan along with an electronic copy of the “Think Tank to Shark Tank” curriculum developed by the University of Akron: <https://uakron.edu/education/think-tank/> .

A-State faculty and Arkansas Small Business Technology Development Center (ASBTDC) representatives will provide video instruction about developing a pitch, developing a business plan, and other helpful topics.

A-State Innovate (“The Garage”) will host weekend and weekday open houses where the buildings are open to participants that would like to use any equipment to develop their prototypes.

The Delta Center for Economic Development will assign each student team a mentor. All mentors are qualified to assist in coaching a team through their business experience or knowledge as professionals.

Program Rules

- Participants may work individually or in groups (maximum of three students per group).
- Participants must prepare a 3-minute elevator pitch, product visual or prototype, and a one- page business plan.
- Participants must send all digital materials and one-page business plan by the deadline of February 5.
- Late submissions will result in point deduction on competition day.
- All group members must contribute, participate, and speak during the presentation.
- All teams must provide at least 2 slides on powerpoint to be shown during the presentation with no audio.
- All individuals/group members should dress in appropriate attire for the competition.
- Each product or business should have a name.
- All scholarship winners must use their funds within eighteen months post graduation date (if graduation date changes contact dced@astate.edu).

- Mentoring session with a local celebrity innovator or venture capitalist
- \$1000 cash for team and \$1000 for school sponsor’s classroom
- \$500 A-State Scholarship for each team member
- Free work space and membership to A-State Innovate for 1 year
- Free patent help, prototyping development, manufacturing advice

Second Prize

- \$500 cash for team and \$500 for school sponsor’s classroom
- \$500 A-State Scholarship for each team member
- Free work space and membership to A-State Innovate for 1 year
- Free patent help, prototyping development, manufacturing advice

Third Prize

- \$150 cash for team and \$150 for school sponsor’s classroom
- \$500 A-State Scholarship for each team member
- Free work space and membership to A-State Innovate for 1 year
